Rabies fact sheet

Did you know? 66 Rabies is a virus which affects the brain. It is passed through the saliva of an infected animal.

More than 99% of human rabies cases are caused by dog bites but other mammals such as cows, horses and cats can pass rabies to humans as well.





- It might start to look nervous and scared for two to three days.
- It will then become angry and will run away from light.
- It will start biting and snapping and have seizures. It might also drool a lot as it will find it difficult to swallow.



Once these signs of rabies start to show, the dog will die. There is no cure against rabies.

Unfortunately for us dogs, a lot of people are scared, and want to kill any dog they find, even if they don't have rabies.

Experts agree that this is **not** an answer to the problem.



What we need to do is get as many dogs **vaccinated** against rabies as possible, including dogs that are owned by people. Some organisations give vaccinations for free.



If you come across a stray dog that looks like it's about to attack:

- Stand still like a tree with your arms by your sides.
- Look down and do not shout.
- If the dog does attacks you, cover your head and your neck with your arm, form a ball on the ground and wait for the dog to go away.
