

EARTH DAY

April 22nd



13 to 16-year olds



Use the bingo game provided to share certain aspects relating to our planet with your learners. You will need to use the **Learners bingo cards**, **bingo pictures**, **Teacher bingo information sheet** and **Earth day information cards**.



Give out the **Learners bingo cards**; perhaps 1 card between 2 learners. The goal of the game is for learners to cover 4 of the 16 squares in a vertical, horizontal, or diagonal row, as pictures get called out.



Put all your **bingo pictures** in a bag or a box and explain that you are going to pull out a picture and that they have to circle the same picture on their bingo board if they happen to have it. Make sure you call out all of the 9 pictures related to Earth Day during the game, as these will allow you to impart new knowledge to your learners. They are: the Earth's core, continents, the Sun, the Moon, forests, the sea, gravity, the Earth spinning and how old our planet is.



As you pull out any of the 9 pictures related to Earth Day, show the bigger version of each picture to the class (**Earth Day information cards**) and read the information relating to that picture from the **Bingo information sheet** provided. Alternatively, to make this more challenging, don't show the picture card and ask learners to listen to your description and to let you know what picture you are describing. There is no information to go with animals featuring on the bingo cards.



Continue pulling pictures out until one of the learners has managed to circle 4 pictures in a row and shouts, 'bingo!'



Ask learners how they feel about their planet and what they will do to respect it.
