

# WORLD VET DAY SCENARIO CARDS

Cut out the following role-play cards and give them out to ask each group. Groups should practise acting out their scene before performing it in front of the whole class.

## Scenario 1 (characters: a donkey, the owner and the vet)

**Character 1:** You are a donkey and you have eaten too much plastic. Your stomach hurts a lot and you don't want to eat anymore.

**Character 2:** You are the owner and you explain the situation to the vet.

**Character 3:** You are the vet. You do a check-up on the donkey's body and when you feel its stomach, the donkey cries. You tell the owner that their donkey has eaten something that's hurting it and you're going to have to watch whether it passes into the dung.

## Scenario 2 (characters: a horse, the owner and the vet)

**Character 1:** You are a horse and you are limping because you have stepped on a nail and it is stuck in your hoof.

**Character 2:** You are the owner and you explain the situation to the vet.

**Character 3:** You are the vet. You see that the horse is holding its leg up from the ground. You check the hoof and discover the nail. You use a pair of pliers to remove the nail and you put anti-septic cream on the wound to avoid infection. You tell the owner that the horse should stop working for a few days so that its wound might heal.

## Scenario 3 (characters: a donkey, the owner and the vet)

**Character 1:** You are a donkey and you try to eat but you can't chew and you spit out your food because you have a tooth abscess.

**Character 2:** You are the owner and you explain the situation to the vet.

**Character 3:** You are the vet and you listen to the owner describing how the donkey behaves. You check the donkey's mouth and you notice the abscess. You give the donkey some antibiotics to fight the infection and anti-inflammatory to stop the pain.

#### **Scenario 4 (characters: a donkey, the owner and the vet)**

**Character 1:** You are a donkey and you have a wound on your back. It's painful and you find it hard to pull the cart because of your wound.

**Character 2:** You are the owner and you explain to the vet that your donkey is not working as hard as usual.

**Character 3:** You are the vet; you take a look at the donkey and you spot the wound on its back. You clean the wound, you put anti-septic on it and a doughnut-like cushion on the wound to stop the harnessing touching the skin. You tell the owner that the donkey should stop working for a few days so that the wound can heal.

#### **Scenario 5 (characters: a dog, the owner and the vet)**

**Character 1:** You are a dog and you keep scratching yourself all over your body to the point of bleeding.

**Character 2:** You are the owner and you describe the situation to the vet.

**Character 3:** You are the vet and you look at the dog's skin. You notice that the dog has fleas. You use a product on the dog's fur that kills all the fleas and their eggs.

#### **Scenario 6 (characters: a horse, the owner and the vet)**

**Character 1:** You are a horse and you refuse to eat. You have diarrhoea all the time. You don't want to greet other horses; you prefer spending time on your own because the pain is making you feel depressed.

**Character 2:** You are the owner and you describe the situation to the vet.

**Character 3:** You are the vet and you analyse the horse's dung. You see that there are many parasites' eggs in the dung so you administer a de-wormer to the horse via a syringe in its mouth. You tell the owner that the horse should stop working for a few days so that it might regain some strength.

### **Scenario 7 (characters: a camel, the owner and the vet)**

**Character 1:** You are a camel and your nose is bleeding. You have an open wound because of the wooden nose peg used by your owner.

**Character 2:** You are the owner and you explain the situation to the vet. You don't understand why your camel has a bleeding nose.

**Character 3:** You are the vet. You look at the camel's nose and you explain to the owner that the wooden peg has split and injured the camel. You give the owner a plastic nose peg. You clean the injury and apply anti-septic so that the wound doesn't get infected. You tell the owner that his camel should stop working for a few days for the wound to heal.
