## **WORLD FROG DAY**



## 5 to 7-year olds

- Show learners the **flashcards representing Frogs around the world**, and for each flashcard, give them the matching facts in your **Teacher's information sheet**. Flashcard 7 represents the picture of a frog catching a mosquito.
- Ask learners why they think that frogs are useful when it comes to mosquitos. (By eating mosquitos, frogs help save some people from getting certain diseases carried by mosquitos.)
- Play a game of "who will be the first to bite?"

Some of your learners will be humans, some will be mosquitos, and some will be frogs. Make sure you have far more humans and frogs than mosquitos. Frogs try and catch mosquitos and can only move by leaping. Humans are not allowed to move at all. Mosquitos can move freely to try and bite a human. The aim of the game is for all the mosquitos to be caught by the frogs. If this is taking too much time, let frogs know that they are allowed to run too.
