

# WORLD RABIES DAY

September 28<sup>th</sup>



## 13 to 16-year olds



Organise your learners into teams of 4 or 5 and let them know that they are going to take part in an animal quiz (use the **Rabies quiz sheet**). If you have time, let them sit in teams and let them answer each question as a team, after conferring. If you don't have so much time, ask the whole class to vote for their answer to each question (there is a choice of 2 to 3 answers). Questions 2 and 9 are trick questions: all possible answers are right.



Discuss questions 7, 8 and 9 of the quiz and get learners to practise the poses that they need to take if they are approached by a dog.



Ask learners to produce a poster: Learners choose a few facts from the quiz they have just played and include these facts in their poster. The goal is to raise awareness on the danger of rabies and the necessity to vaccinate all dogs / keep away from stray dogs. You might want to finish the posters in another lesson, or at home.



Display the posters in prominent, public places in the school or the community. The class could use what they have learnt in this lesson to plan and perform an assembly for the whole school, explaining how to prevent dog bites.
