

Catch the question

Introducing new knowledge or recalling knowledge

This activity will help your learners answer a question in a fun way, and help them focus on the next activity you choose to suggest.

preparation

- Get a ball and write a number on as many parts of the ball as possible. Maybe put Sellotape over the numbers so that the ink doesn't run when the ball moves from hand to hand.
- Each number will refer to a specific question related to your lesson.
- Prepare the corresponding questions on a sheet of paper.

procedure

- Ask your learners to stand in a circle or to simply stand behind their desks.
- Throw the ball at a learner and ask them the question related to the number that they are holding.
- Make sure you agree with your learners which hand and which finger will determine the number they will be asked about.
- For example, tell them: you will get a question related to the number that is the closest to your left index.

Number-related questions:

- 1. Name an example of a prey.
- 2. Name an example of a predator.
- 3. Name an example of an animal who is both a predator and prey.
- 4. Name a mammal who lives in the ocean.
- 5. What is special about reptiles?
